Here are some examples of how our building partners meet these expectations:

- Offering student internships, service learning opportunities
- Participate in special lectures and seminars open to selected students
- Providing guest lectures
- Participate in mentoring programs
- Utilizing students and faculty for research and consultation
- Participating in <u>special events</u> to expose students to the operations of the community partner and its impact on the community
- Collaborating with other community/university CEC building partners in mutually beneficial ways
- Sharing news and lessons learned from the CEC experience through UNO public relations materials, social media, and organizational communications
- Working collaboratively and democratically within the CEC environment to ensure the overall goals of the CEC are met
- Participating in annual surveys and evaluation

CEC community building partners should be prepared to <u>report</u> their participation and contributions in these types of activities on a regular basis through an online form and by communicating with CEC staff.
